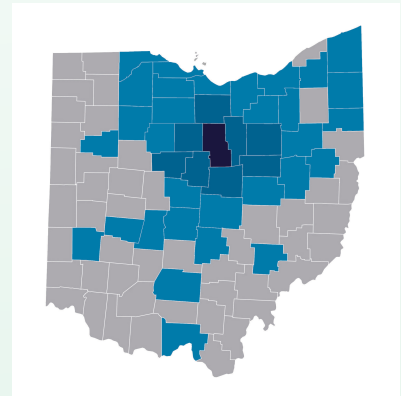

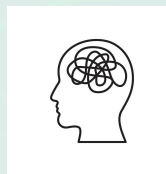

# FISCAL YEAR 2024 UPDATES

Through generous grants from the Sterkel Foundation we were able to update the lobbies in our Center and Rehab buildings.

At the Center, our 741 Scholl Road building, where our behavioral health urgent care is located, the lobby underwent drastic changes. Carpeting was replaced with hard floors, lights were updated to LEDs, new ceiling tiles were installed, and the walls had wallpaper removed, and were painted. The reception desk was updated to offer more privacy.



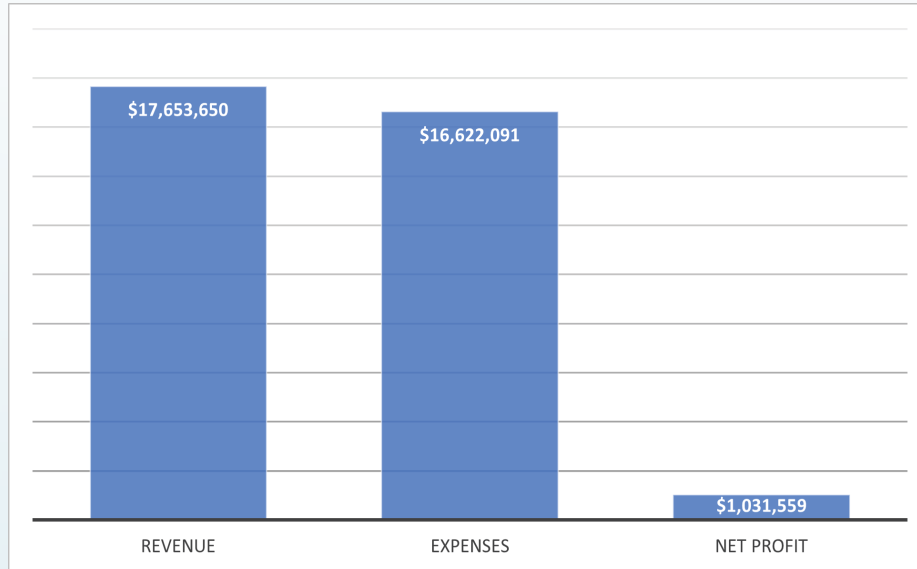
